

The building committee has met and agreed to pursue a schematic / conceptual proposal for a new building to be located on the lot beside the current Family Life Center. The new building will consist primarily of youth/child classrooms, an adult classroom, preschool and afterschool, office and storage space, a half-court sized gymnasium/multipurpose room and necessary additions such as foyer, restrooms, etc. The size of the building will be approximately 11,500 square feet. The building will be located on the lot to maximize the remainder of the lot for parking with the possibility of a playground behind the new building. The building will be completely handicap accessible.

The building committee is also determining the requirements to renovate that will add a restroom to the sanctuary side of the property that will be accessible from the sanctuary level without the need to go up or down steps from the sanctuary floor.

This renovation will be planned to take place as soon as possible provided the costs are approved in the budget year for capital improvements.

It is exciting to be a part of all God is doing in this church.
