

SHEPHERDING COMMITTEE

What is it? Members of our church family divided into groups who will be responsible for providing a meal for bereaved family members upon the death of a church member. Its purpose is to ensure that every member is remembered at this critical time and to distribute the responsibility as evenly as possible among all of our members.

We now have seven shepherding groups. Two co-chairpersons lead each group. An 8th Group is in the process of being formed. At present, each group serves one or two meals per year. The Shepherding Committee is an important mission outreach of our church.

Here is how it works:

- The church office notifies the Chairperson of the Shepherding Committee of the death of a church member.
- The chairperson then notifies the group co-chairperson(s).

Responsibility of Group Co-Chairpersons:

- Visit or call the bereaved family
- Determine when and where they would like their meal to be served
- Determine how many people will be fed
- Plan the meal
- Contact group members for food donations
- Help serve the meal and clean up
- Return dishes to Fellowship Hall or Family Life Center for pick-up (if meal is served in the home).

The Shepherding Committee is made up of volunteers but everyone is encouraged to participate. If you are unable to cook, you may want to provide money for the meal.
